

#### What is Orenitram?

Orenitram is a prescription medicine used to treat pulmonary arterial hypertension (PAH) which is high blood pressure in the arteries of your lungs. Orenitram can help slow down the progression of your disease and improve your ability to exercise. It is not known if Orenitram is safe and effective in children.

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Patients taking Orenitram either improved or maintained their risk status—and improvement was seen as early as 3 months. In fact, more than 30% of patients improved and were able to maintain improvement through week 60.

Your healthcare provider may use risk status to make decisions about your treatment. It helps them determine how you're doing today and predict how you will be doing in the future.

You can feel confident starting Orenitram—the tablet form of the same proven and trusted type of medicine that has been available as a pump therapy for more than 18 years.

\*In a clinical study that included 690 patients who were all taking a single oral PAH medicine (PDE-5i, sGCS, or ERA). At the beginning of the study, these patients added either Orenitram or placebo to their treatment.

<sup>†</sup>In a clinical study that included 349 patients not taking any PAH therapy. At the beginning of the study, these patients began taking either Orenitram or placebo.

## Get to know your Access Solutions and Support Team (ASSIST)



ASSIST is a team at United Therapeutics, the maker of Orenitram, committed to helping you with your prescription. Within 24 hours of receiving your Orenitram prescription, ASSIST will contact you so they can:

- Verify your insurance information
- Review next steps
- Discuss eligibility for financial assistance options such as the Orenitram co-pay program
- Connect you with a Specialty Pharmacy

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION for Orenitram What should I tell my healthcare provider before taking Orenitram? (cont) Tell your healthcare provider:

• If you are pregnant, breastfeeding, and/or plan to become pregnant or breastfeed. It is not known if Orenitram will harm your unborn baby or if Orenitram passes into your breast milk. Talk to your healthcare provider about the best way to feed your baby during treatment with Orenitram.



Be sure to answer or return any calls from ASSIST so you can get started on your treatment with Orenitram. The caller ID will be labeled as ASSIST, with a Melbourne, Florida, area code of 321.

# IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION for Orenitram What should I tell my healthcare provider before taking Orenitram? (cont) Tell your healthcare provider:

• About all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Orenitram and other medicines may affect each other causing side effects. Do not start any new medicine until you check with your healthcare provider. Especially tell your healthcare provider if you take another medicine that contains treprostinil, such as Remodulin® or Tyvaso®.

### Getting started with your Specialty Pharmacy

After your initial call with ASSIST, they will forward your prescription, insurance information, and financial program eligibility to your Specialty Pharmacy (SP).

#### What is a Specialty Pharmacy and how can it help?



Specialty Pharmacies provide extra services compared with retail pharmacies and will work with your healthcare team to coordinate various aspects of your treatment. Your Specialty Pharmacy is also there to help answer any questions about your treatment.

#### Some aspects of your treatment that your SP will help you with include:

- Reviewing all your insurance information
- Scheduling nurse visits to get you started with treatment
- Educating you on taking and slowly increasing Orenitram over time, and side effect management tips through in-person or virtual visits and 24-hour phone support
- Coordinating the delivery of your medicine

#### **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION for Orenitram**

#### **How should I take Orenitram?**

- Do not change your dose or suddenly stop taking Orenitram without first talking to your healthcare provider.
- Orenitram is usually taken 3 times a day (about every 8 hours) or 2 times a day (about every 12 hours). Your healthcare provider will tell you how often you should take Orenitram. If you have side effects, your healthcare provider may tell you to change your dose or when you take Orenitram. Take Orenitram with food.



At United Therapeutics, we work with two Specialty Pharmacies that specialize in PAH. Your Orenitram prescription will be handled and delivered by these SPs, instead of your local pharmacy.

Your insurance provider will determine which one of these you will work with.





## IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION for Orenitram How should I take Orenitram? (cont)

 Swallow Orenitram tablets whole. Do not split, chew, crush, or break your Orenitram tablets. Do not take Orenitram tablets that are damaged or broken. If Orenitram tablets are not taken whole, they may release too much medicine at one time. This can lead to side effects.



#### **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION for Orenitram**

#### **How should I take Orenitram? (cont)**

- If you miss your dose of Orenitram, take the missed dose as soon as possible with food.
- If you miss 2 or more doses of Orenitram, call your healthcare provider to see if you need to change your dose.
- If you take too much Orenitram, call your healthcare provider or go to the nearest hospital emergency room right away.



#### **Patient Starter Kit**

You will receive a kit with your first shipment of Orenitram. Inside you will find an assortment of helpful resources to ensure you are set up for a successful start with Orenitram.

\*TO ENROLL IN THIS PROGRAM, YOU MUST UNDERSTAND AND AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AND TERMS OF USE.

Eligibility requirements for this program are:

Patients must be 18 years or older to use this Program. The Program is valid only for patients with commercial (also known as private) insurance who are taking the medication for an FDA-approved indication. Patients using Medicare, Medicaid, or any other state or federal government program to pay for their medications are not eligible. Patients who start utilizing government coverage during the term of the Program will no longer be eligible. Eligible patients must be residents of the United States or Puerto Rico.

#### **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION for Orenitram**

#### **How should I take Orenitram? (cont)**

 You may see the tablet shell in your stools (bowel movements). This is usually normal. The tablet shell is not digested. If you have diverticulosis, the tablet shell may get stuck in a blind pouch or diverticulum in your intestine.

#### What are the possible side effects of Orenitram?

Orenitram can cause serious side effects, including worsening of PAH symptoms.

### Develop a plan to help you capture more good days

Orenitram may cause side effects. Because of the way Orenitram works, it's possible you may experience side effects before you feel the medicine working to improve your symptoms.
